Description: VET in schools multiplies opportunities for students. It enables students to complete a nationally recognised vocational qualification as well as contribute towards their VCE or VCAL Certificate. Classroom learning is combined with structured hands-on training and practice in industry. The program aims to provide students with the knowledge and skills to achieve competencies that will enhance their employment prospects in the agricultural industry and to gain a recognised credential and make a more informed choice regarding further education and career paths.



Contribution to the VCE/VCAL:

On completion of the program students are eligible for four credits towards their VCE, two at Units 1-2 level and a Unit 3-4 sequence.

Students who successfully complete the Unit 3-4 sequence will be eligible for a 10% increment towards their ATAR.

This program will also satisfy the learning outcomes for the VCAL Industry Specific and the Work Related Skills strand

What to bring:

Students are required to wear appropriate clothes and footwear for working with animals in a farm environment.

Structures Workplace Learning (SWL)

This course requires students to undertake 80 hours of Structured Workplace Learning, 40 hours each year. This provides the opportunity for students to demonstrate competencies acquired on-the-job.

Students undertaking this course are required to fulfil an industry specific workplace learning, which contributes to the completion of the competency. "Work in the animal care industry", and provides an opportunity to demonstrate competencies acquired off the job. During this time student's will be required to complete work place activities.
