Description: The aim of the course is to provide the basic skills and knowledge to become an animal carer. You will learn how to care for a variety of animals and provide information on companion animals, products and services. You will gain the practical skills and basic knowledge you need for entry-level work in the animal care industry. You will learn how to assist with general animal care, provide food and water for animals and follow occupational health and safety procedures in the workplace. You will undertake work in our animal facility throughout the year giving you the opportunity to work with mice, rats, guinea pigs, rabbits, fish and reptiles. You will also have dogs and cats regularly attend class for practical training. This course involves both practical and written assessments and students will be required to complete work at home between classes. This course may provide you with entry level employment in animal rescue centres, pet retail shops, welfare organisations and veterinary clinics, etc.

Contribution to the VCE/VCAL:

On successful completion of this program, you will be eligible for:

- recognition of up to two units at Units 1 and 2 level and a Units 3 and 4 sequence.
- Students who receive a Units 3 and 4 sequence for ACM20117 – Certificate II in Animal Studies will be eligible

for an increment towards their ATAR. (10% of the lowest study score of the primary four).

- The increment is awarded by the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC).
