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#### Description:

VET in schools multiplies opportunities for students. They enable students to complete a Nationally recognised vocational qualification as well as contribute towards their VCE or VCAL Certificate. Classroom learning is combined with structured hands on training and practice in industry. The aim of the course is to provide students with the skills and knowledge to achieve competencies that will enhance their employment prospects in the textiles, clothing and footwear industry and to enable students to make a more informed choice regarding further education and career paths.

#### Contribution to the VCE/VCAL:

On completion of the program students are eligible for five credits towards their VCE, three at Unit 1-2 level and a Unit 3-4 sequence. Students who successfully complete the Unit 3-4 sequence will be eligible for a 10% increment towards their ATAR. ### What to bring:

Students are required to purchase a folio and sewing kit. Details regarding the requirements for the kit will be provided on enrolment. At least 4 garments will be expected to be made per year and therefore material will need to be purchased throughout the year.

### Structures Workplace Learning (SWL)

Students will be required to undertake 40 hours (1 week) of SWL in their first year. A Logbook will be provided. Students undertaking this course are required to undertake 40 hours of structured workplace learning, which contributes to the completion of the competency. "Work in the Textiles, Clothing & Footwear industry", and provides an opportunity to demonstrate competencies acquired off the job. During this time, students will be required to complete work place activities.
