Description:

Certificate II in Kitchen Operations is an introductory course that prepares students for food preparations and cookery skills in order to prepare food and menu items.

Contribution to the VCE/VCAL:

On completion of the program students are eligible for five credits towards their VCE, three at Unit 1-2 level and Unit 3-4 sequence.

Students wishing to receive an ATAR contribution must undertake scored assessment for the purpose of achieving a **study score**. This study score can contribute directly to the primary four or as a fifth or sixth subject.

Note: Where a student elects not to receive a study score for Cert II in Kitchen Operations, no contribution to the ATAR will be available.
