Description: We provide the skills, knowledge and attitudes for training in acting for Film and Television. During 2020 with the changes to delivery our students successfully embraced online learning and some of these platforms will be utilised showing how you can build more efficacy in blended learning into the future.

VET Acting is delivered to Year 10, 11 and 12 students who are passionate about this specialised subject. The units of competency are designed to give a common-sense approach to learning.

- Filming in front of camera
- Confidence and communication builder
- Skills proficiency in interviewing, auditioning and screen-testing
- Develop digital skills that will ensure relevance and transferability to industry
- Production of a film project using the UOC electives needed in the second year
- Training caters for VCAL, VCE and accelerated students from a diverse range of back grounds

Contribution to VCAL/VCE:

On completion of the program students are eligible for four credits towards their VCE, two at Unit 1-2 and a Unit 3-4 sequence. Students who successfully complete the Unit 3-4 sequence will be eligible for a 10% increment towards their ATAR. VTAC may award students who receive a Units 3 & 4 sequence though Block Credit recognition, 10% of their fourth subject.

What to bring:

Students are required to bring 1 x A4 binder notebook, pens and high-lighters.

Students are issued with a memory card and card reader along with software. This is designed so students can view their progress and undertake self-critique. The card is returned at the end of the course. The software is to be installed on a PC, or with MAC computers having the ability to play the footage automatically through iMovie or Quicktime. Students are required to bring the memory card to every filming.
